## First day of MHS Virtual Learning will be August 25th For ALL VIRTUAL STUDENTS

Virtual students will spend the first week of school attending small group sessions with their teacher and/or 1-1 sessions with their teacher.

- Each teacher will post on their Google Classroom times they are hosting virtual class introductory sessions. These sessions will last approximately 10 - 20 minutes. Every student will need to attend one session for each of their virtual courses.
- Teachers will also post a sign up for students to meet with them 1-1. These will be 5 - 10 minutes in length on a first come first serve basis.
- In addition there will be get-to-know you activities posted on google classroom for students to get used to this mode of delivery and get acquainted with their teacher and potential virtual classmates.
- Students taking an AP Course will join their class at their assigned time in PowerSchool synchronously via Google Meet.

By the end of next week each student will have a more detailed schedule as to when they are to attend each virtual class. Daily attendance is required. There may be some flexibility within a students schedule if on a certain day they have a conflict they can reach out to their virtual teacher and ask to attend during an alternate time. If the student is not required to attend virtually (synchronous) their attendance for that day will be based on fulfilling the teacher directed instruction that was posted on their Google Classroom. For example, they may turn in assignments, complete a Google formative assessment, respond to a discussion post. It will be essential for students to log in and check their email and Google Classroom each morning before the start of class.
